Liturgy of the Word

First Reading: Acts 1:1-11

Reader: A Reading from the Acts of the Apostles

Jesus was lifted up while they looked on

In my earlier work, Theophilus, I dealt with everything Jesus had done and taught from the beginning until the day he gave his instructions to the apostles he had chosen through the Holy Spirit, and was taken up to heaven. He had shown himself alive to them after his Passion by many demonstrations: for forty days he had continued to appear to them and tell them about the kingdom of God. When he had been at table with them, he had told them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for what the Father had promised. 'It is' he had said 'what you have heard me speak about: John baptised with water but you, not many days from now, will be baptised with the Holy Spirit.'

Now having met together, they asked him, 'Lord, has the time come? Are you going to restore the kingdom to Israel?' He replied, 'It is not for you to know times or dates that the Father has decided by his own authority, but you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and then you will be my witnesses not only in Jerusalem but throughout Judaea and Samaria, and indeed to the ends of the earth.'

As he said this he was lifted up while they looked on, and a cloud took him from their sight. They were still staring into the sky when suddenly two men in white were standing near them and they said, 'Why are you men from Galilee standing here looking

into the sky? Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven, this same Jesus will come back in the same way as you have seen him go there.'

Reader; A Reading from the letter of Paul to the Ephesians

God made him sit at his right hand in heaven

May the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, give you a spirit of wisdom and perception of what is revealed, to bring you to full knowledge of him. May he

enlighten the eyes of your mind so that you can see what hope his call holds for you, what rich glories he has promised the saints will inherit and how infinitely great is the power that he has exercised for us believers. This you can tell from the strength of his power at work in Christ, when he used it to raise him from the dead and to make him sit at his right hand, in heaven, far above every Sovereignty, Authority, Power, or Domination, or any other name that can be named not only in this age but also in the age to come. He has put all things under his feet and made him, as the ruler of everything, the head of the Church; which is his body, the fullness of him who fills the whole creation.

Gospel: Matthew 28:16-20

Reader: A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mathew

All: Glory to you, O Lord.

Go and make disciples of all nations

The eleven disciples set out for Galilee, to the mountain where Jesus had arranged to meet them. When they saw him they fell down before him, though some hesitated. Jesus came up and spoke to them. He said, 'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, make disciples of all the nations; baptise them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teach them to observe all the commands I gave you. And know that I am with you always; yes, to the end of time.'

The Gospel of the Lord

All: Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

Reflection: Leading his disciples out of the city across the Mount of Olives, Jesus ascends to Heaven. "When they saw him, they worshiped," a statement suggestive of our own worship and the manifestation of Jesus as Lord, as the only begotten Son of God. The main emphasis of Jesus' command is "making disciples", while asking them to go, baptize and teach them to observe his commandments. The word for 'disciple' is matheteuo, meaning a follower, a learner. As disciples we are always asked to identify with Jesus and to learn from him. The Great commission, "Go, therefore, make disciples of all nations, baptize them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit" emphasizes on four "all" revealing its fourfold dimension: Jesus possesses all authority; he sends us to all nations; we are to teach all people all that he has commanded, and we are to know that Jesus will be with us all the days of our life. Therefore, we are asked to acknowledge his authority over the universe and follow him fully and to do whatever he has commanded in its entirety. We have been given a very great task but we are assured that he will be with us 'to the close of the ages'. Do we believe that we are his disciples, called to identify with him and learn from him? How do we understand his mission command today?

The Creed:

I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; he descended into hell; on the third day he rose again from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty; from there he will come to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection the body, and life everlasting. Amen.

Head: As we celebrate Jesus' Ascension into heaven in the presence of the apostles, we are filled with a vision of our own raising to an eternal life with God. Let us then, keep in mind St. Paul's words that we have to aspire to receive a spirit of wisdom only after which we will be able to understand the glorious riches that await us and those who believe in Jesus' Ascension into heaven. Therefore, filled with the hope that we will follow Jesus to his everlasting kingdom and dominion we come before the Heavenly father with our present needs as we put forward our petitions before the Lord,

Let our response be: Lord, hear our prayers and fill us with a hope of salvation...

- 1. We pray for the Holy Father, Bishops, Priests and Religious that the Spirit of God may strengthen them in their work and that they may encourage all people to believe in the words of the scriptures and of the hope of an eternal life with God.
- 2. We pray for those in Government offices and in social ministries, that they may be inspired to frame rules that will enable the poor and the homeless to obtain the help they need to survive the pandemic situation.
- 3. We pray for the health workers and first responders all over the world that God may give them the courage and mental and physical strength to continue to do their good work of treating the infected patients and that the medical institutions and various organisations may provide them free facilities to enable them to carry out their work efficiently.
- 4. We pray for those who do not believe in God, that they may avail of the Scriptures available in the world in many ways in physical and through technological means and that they may have an encounter with the Holy Spirit to understand the love of God that awaits them in their situation in life.
- 5. Let us pray for our personal needs.

Head: Heavenly Father, we believe that you have planned for us a life of eternal happiness with you in your kingdom which will never end. Strengthen us, therefore, in this earthly life of ours, that we may not fall into temptation and that we may hold on to Jesus, who loves us to the end, we make this prayer, through Christ our Lord,

We offer prayers in supplication, O Lord, to honour the wondrous Ascension of your Son: grant, we pray, that through this most holy exchange we, too, may rise up to the heavenly realms. Through Christ our Lord.
